

Dear Resident,

We will work closely with Matthew Barber, if elected, to make Slough a safer place to live.

Matthew is the only candidate with the skills and experience to ensure strong local policies for every community in the Thames Valley are implemented. Having campaigned for many years and listening to local people, he has a clear plan to get tough on crime for safer communities.

His top priority in 'My Plan to tackle crime in Thames Valley' is strong local policing. That means increasing the visibility of police officers and PCSOs and working in partnership with councils to tackle anti-social behaviour when it occurs and seeking to prevent it happening in the future.

If elected he will agree a new local policing strategy with the police, looking at everything from where officers are based, the resources available to neighbourhood teams, to how local officers work to tackle long-term issues and prevent crime rather than responding when things go wrong.

We need to ensure the police are able to manage neighbourhood crimes such as vehicle crime and criminal damage that can make people feel unsafe and damage confidence in local policing.

Working with the public, councils and the police we can be tough on crime for safer communities.

Securing our finances

Our pledge for sound financial management:

- Tackling the nearly £1 billion of debt which the Council is forecast to accumulate by 2023/24.
- Opposing Slough Labour's unfair, and unaffordable Council Tax rise of 4.99%
- Supporting our local businesses to stimulate Slough's recovery post-pandemic.

Slough Conservatives believe in sound financial management, ensuring that the burden does not fall on Slough residents in terms of ever-increasing Council Tax.

Your strong local Conservative team will continue to oppose unaffordable Council Tax rises, based on a belief that the residents of Slough should not have to foot the bill for Labour's economic mismanagement.

We believe that the backbone of our local community is our residents and businesses. Since the start of the pandemic, the Conservative Government has provided over £52 million in Self Employed Income Support Scheme payments to Slough residents, and over £33 million in Coronavirus Business Interruption Loans to Slough businesses.

This manifesto seeks to support residents and businesses alike, in the same vein. That is why we are proposing a Shop Front Enhancement Grant to businesses on Slough High Street— supporting our local businesses, improving the aesthetic of the High Street and encouraging a trend of shop local. To further support these efforts, we will be proposing Free Christmas Parking from November 2021-January 2022, further supporting local businesses and encouraging residents

to use the town centre.

A key commitment we will make to you, is that we will tackle the impending debt crisis which Slough Labour have created. To start this, we will sell the Council Offices, and use the leftover funds are leaseback arrangements are in place, to pay off around £20 million of Council debt. This would be a starting point in our actions to tackle this growing issue, which has the potential to impact on each and every resident in Slough.

It's time for a leadership with the determination to tackle these issues, and with the vision to support our local businesses so that they can thrive post-COVID.

It's time that the residents of Slough had a leadership determined to tell residents the truth, and provide the transparency our constituents deserve. This is not limited to the debt crisis we find ourselves in. That is why we will ensure that residents have access to the Trustee Committee meetings. Councillors should not be taking decisions, as trustees for this town, without residents being able to view, or scrutinise the decisions made.



Building back better in Slough.

Key actions points for Slough:

- Supporting our most vulnerable children in Slough, identified as being most impacted by COVID-19, with a £100,000 fund to provide One to One tuition sessions.
- Expanding the provision of good quality Free School Meals, with an additional £100,000 designated
- Investing in a local air quality organisation, aimed at raising awareness and community engagement on the issue of air pollution in Slough.

As we emerge from the COVID-19 pandemic, building back our communities better, has never been so important. That starts with you, the residents of Slough.

We will support our most vulnerable children in Slough, identified as being most adversely impacted by COVID-19 by our Education Teams, with a £100,000 dedicated fund for One to One tuition sessions to support them. This will be an important avenue of support in helping these children 'catch up'. This is on top of the 367 laptops which the Conservative Government provided to children across Slough to facilitate online learning.

Moreover, we will provide a further £100,000 on top of the funding already allocated, to expand the provision of good quality Free School Meals during the summer holidays. This builds on the £475,000 made available from the Government's 'Winter Grant Scheme' in supporting families across Slough.

And we will build back greener. Slough has one of the highest levels of Air Pollution related deaths in the South East. This is not only an environmental issue, but a public health one too. We will take comprehensive action to tackle this issue, and ensure that the air we breathe is clean.

We will implement a Zero Emissions Network across Slough to offer advice to businesses who wish to reduce their emissions. We will invest in innovative approaches and technologies to tackle roadside Nitrogen Dioxide emissions. And we will raise public awareness of air pollution, by providing £48,000 to form a local air quality organisation. This will build local understanding of air pollution, and engaging the local community in accessing and taking action on local issues. We will also create a free, fly-tipping hotline in Slough, to help preserve our local environment.

And we will protect our green spaces across Slough; from Mercian Way Recreation Ground to Langley Memorial Park. Our green spaces have been a lifeline to many this year, and have proven invaluable in terms of our physical and mental wellbeing. We will ensure they are protected for generations to come.

By supporting our young people across Slough; protecting our local environment and ensuring our children have the educational support they need, we can build back better in Slough.
